INTRODUCTION: WHAT NEEDS TO BE TALKED ABOUT? SIGNIFICANT ELEMENTS & FEATURES IN C. BUKOWSKI'S "THE TRASH MEN"

(In class)

Let's begin with a short poem, "the trash men" by the American writer Charles Bukowski (1920-94). I'll read the poem then give you a few minutes to list at least *three* elements or features you think deserve *special attention* when considering the poem's meaning and effect. Then, I will ask each of you to tell the class *one* of features you identified.

Of course, we can't help but be interested in the poem's meaning; but our primary concern today is to identify the features we think shouldn't be overlooked in a serious examination of the poem.

Charles Bukowski, "the trash men" (1974)

here they come these guys gray truck radio playing

5 they are in a hurry

it's quite exciting: shirt open bellies hanging out

they run out the trash bins
10 roll them out to the fork lift
and then the truck grinds it upward
with far too much sound . . .

they had to fill out application forms to get these jobs 15 they are paying for homes and drive late model cars

they get drunk on Saturday night

now in the Los Angeles sunshine they run back and forth with their trash bins

20 all that trash goes somewhere

and they shout to each other

then they are all up in the truck driving west toward the sea

none of them know
